





What do we have already?





<u>Specific objective 4.1</u> More people benefitting from stronger Central Baltic communities

Applications:

• 26 (Call 1) + 26 (Call 2) + 16 (Call 3) = 68

Approved applications:

• 6 (Call 1) + 5 (Call 2) + 7 (Call 3) = 18



More people benefitting from stronger Central Baltic communities

- Weaknesses:
- Target group is not clearly defined
- Target groups social inclusion problems are not defined
- Target group is not directly benefitting from the project



<u>Specific objective 4.1</u> More people benefitting from stronger Central Baltic communities

Expected results and outputs from the approved projects:

- 9 (Call 1) + 6 (Call 2) + 7 (Call 3) = 22 communities with improvements (target value 30)
- 1810 (Call 1) + 1150 (Call 2) + 3280 (Call 3) = 6240 persons participating in project activities (target value 5000)



<u>Specific objective 4.1</u> More people benefitting from stronger Central Baltic communities

Share of aligned vocational education and training (VET) programmes in the Central Baltic region

Applications:

• 22 (Call 1) + 25 (Call 2) + 16 (Call 3) = 63

Approved applications:

5 (Call 1) + 5 (Call 2) + 1 (Call 3) = 11

Allowed to submit 2nd step application 4 (Call 3)



- Weaknesses:
- The curricula/VET programme to be aligned is not defined
- Targeting general development of VET
- VET/applied higher education institutions are not involved in project



Share of aligned vocational education and training (VET) programmes in the Central Baltic region

Expected results and outputs from approved projects:

- Number of aligned VET programmes:
 8 + 9 + 7 = 24 (target value 15)
- Number of benefitting vocational education schools - 19 + 23 + 19 = 61 (target value 15)

More people benefitting from stronger Central Baltic communities

- <u>Project applications for SO 4.1 are still needed</u> in the 4th Call for proposals in order to fulfill the programme indicators.
- Projects targeting any of the groups under risk of social exclusion are eligible.
- Especially welcome would be applications preventing the social exclusion and providing employment opportunities for minorities and immigrants.



- Indicators are fulfilled by the projects from 1st, 2nd and 3rd Call
- Not yet decided if the SO will be open for the 4th Call for proposals



Financing still available


- ERDF for Priority 4 in total €11 500 000
